

Community Foundation of Campbellford/Seymour and Northumberland Charitable Purposes

1. To advance education, primarily in the Campbellford/Seymour and Northumberland region, including by:
 - a. providing training, courses, seminars, workshops and programs that build individual citizens' capacity for leadership and effective participation in community life;
 - b. providing scholarships, bursaries, awards and other forms of financial assistance to students;
2. To promote health, primarily in the Campbellford/Seymour and Northumberland region, including by:
 - a. Facilitating the delivery of health care services;
 - b. Providing access to health and psychological counselling, group support programs, and social services;
 - c. encouraging and facilitating general physical fitness by providing public sport and recreational facilities, as well as public fitness programs and opportunities;
3. To hold, primarily in the Campbellford/Seymour and Northumberland region, concerts and other artistic events and arts and crafts exhibitions where skills are demonstrated, and products are displayed for the purpose of increasing the public's understanding and appreciation for a particular art form or to promote more effective methods of preserving the art form;
4. To protect the environment, primarily in the Campbellford/Seymour and Northumberland region, including by conserving or restoring ecosystems and biodiversity on a long-term basis;
5. To provide public amenities, primarily in the Campbellford/Seymour and Northumberland region, including by establishing and maintaining children's playgrounds, memorial gardens, multi-use recreational facilities and museums;
6. To protect and preserve significant heritage sites, primarily in the Campbellford/Seymour and Northumberland region, including by restoring, developing and maintaining heritage sites in Campbellford/Seymour and Northumberland;
7. To relieve poverty, primarily in the Campbellford/Seymour and Northumberland region, including by providing financial assistance and/or basic necessities of life, including food, clean water, clothing, and shelter, to support individuals or families who are experiencing poverty, of low income, or in need;
8. To address and prevent specific problems faced by children and youth primarily in the Campbellford/Seymour and Northumberland region, such as bullying, peer pressure, substance abuse, low self-esteem, victimization, and unemployment, including by providing programs to children and youth who are shown to need assistance;
9. To increase the efficiency and effectiveness of qualified donees by providing financial support, advice and capacity building to foster the environmental, social, cultural and economic sustainability of the community through charitable means;
10. To receive and maintain a fund or funds and to apply all or part of the principal and income therefrom, by way of a formal grants program to qualified donees (as that term is defined in the *Income Tax Act (Canada)*;
11. To do all such things as are incidental and ancillary to the attainment of the foregoing purposes and the exercise of the powers of the corporation.
