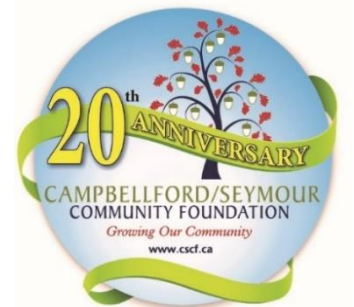

Land Acknowledgement

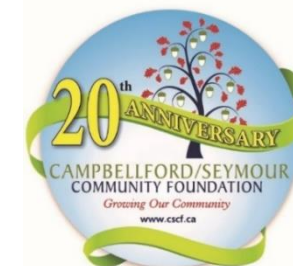

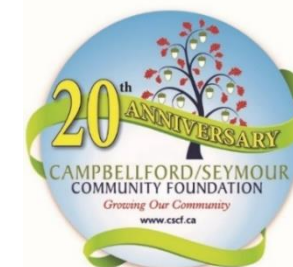
Group Agreements

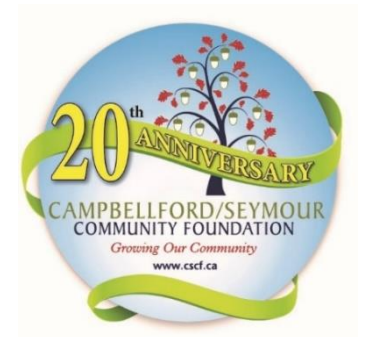
Charging Station and Bee City Designation

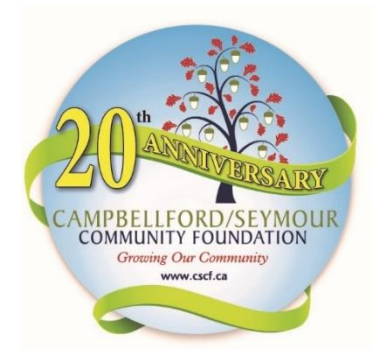

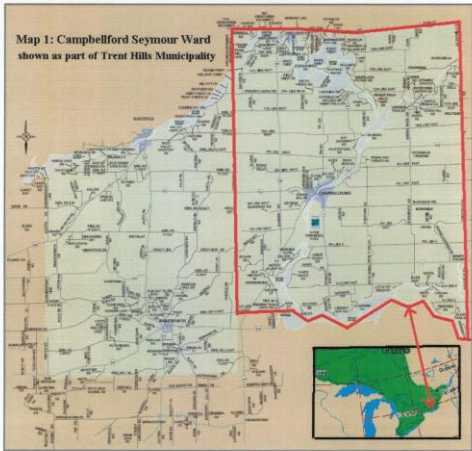

The Environmental Scan created in 2008 inspired the Environmental Committee to create a Community Garden to provide fresh vegetables to community members and our local food bank.





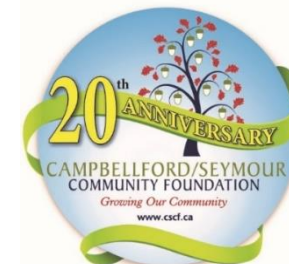

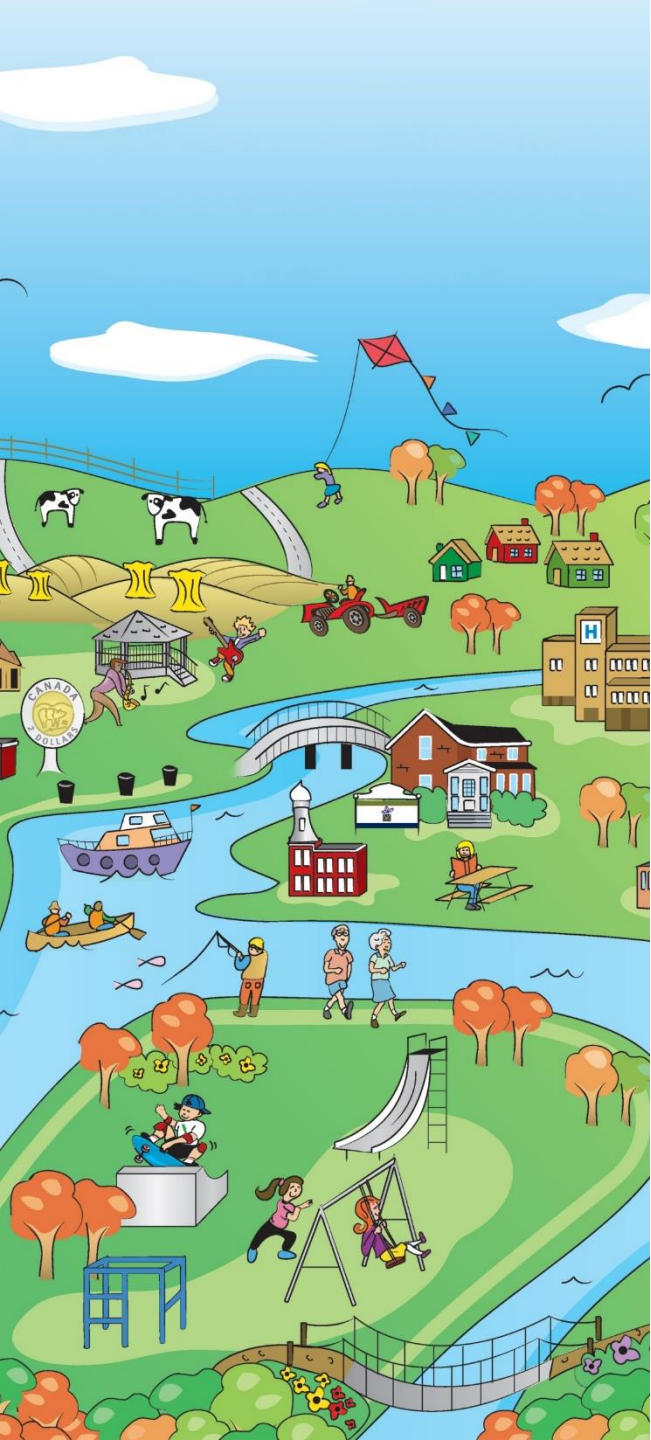

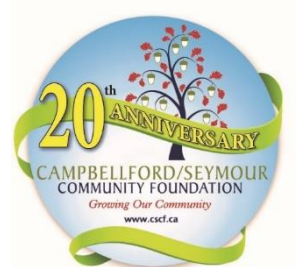




Campbellford/Seymour Community Foundation

2003 – 2021 Environmental Grants

- 32 grant projects
- Total Environmental grant funding = **\$374,247.12**
- Highlighting 3 interesting projects:
 - \$25,000 to **Campbellford Memorial Hospital**
 - \$11,000 to **local schools**
 - \$ 4,908 to **Bike Action Trent Hills, in partnership**





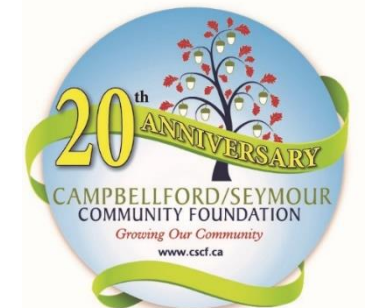
Environmental Grant Projects

- Created in 2007 by **Members of the CSCF Environment Committee** with initial \$500 gift
- To provide **grants for environmental projects**

Definition Of Terms

🔦 **Environmental Stewardship (2009 Committee Action Plan)** The protection or maintenance of biodiversity and unique ecosystem communities as well as the restoration of degraded ecosystems or threatened species. Environmental information, education and awareness are fundamental to protecting and maintaining healthy ecosystems.



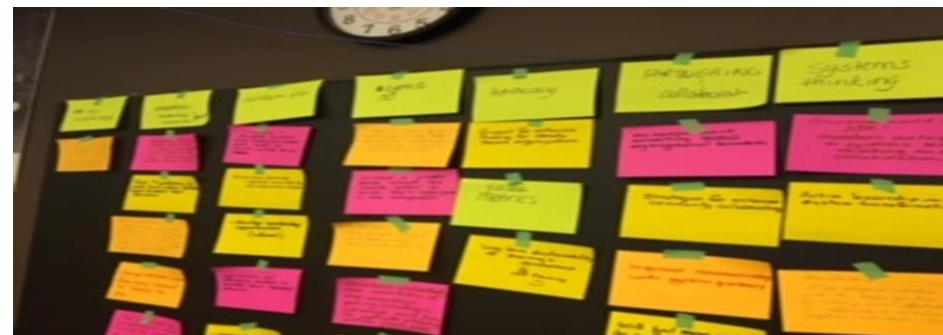
🌱 **Sustainable Community (2009 Action Plan):** A balance between the negative and positive impacts of a viable local economy as well as respect for cultural, social and environmental diversity. Key areas of interest include integrated community sustainability planning, sustainable agriculture specifically the marketing of local foods and products, the maintenance and enhancement of recreational opportunities and energy efficiency.

🌱 **Capacity Building (2009 Action Plan):** The enhancement of funds, resources and expertise to promote and support work of the Environment Committee

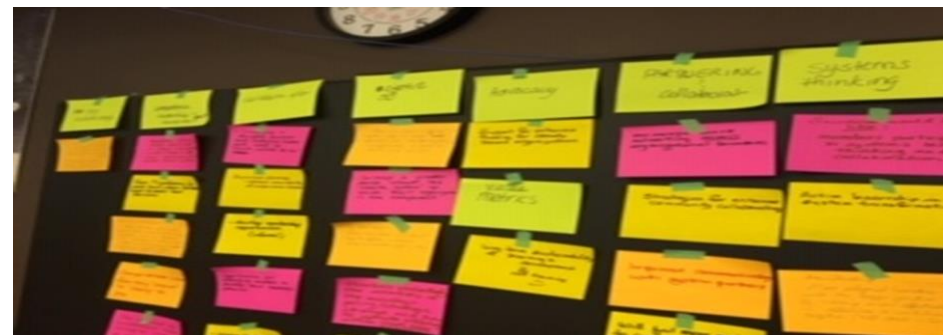
What are the existing strengths of the community to support, protect and/or enhance environmental stewardship and sustainable communities?

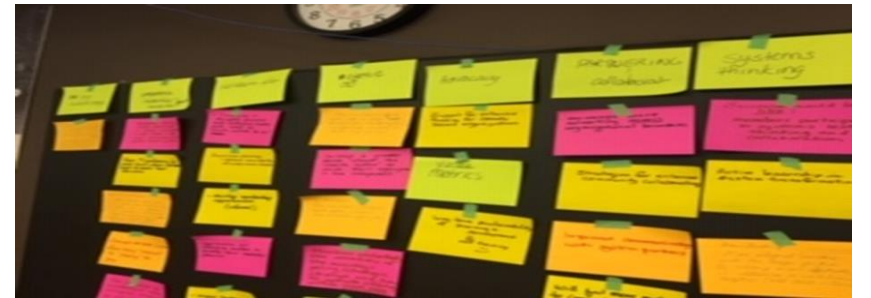

Question Burst Scenarios

- 🔊 In groups of 2 or 3 people review the scenario for the “Questions Burst” exercise. You will have 4 minutes to collectively generate as many questions as possible about the scenario.
- 🔊 Follow two rules: Don’t answer any of the questions and don’t explain why you’re asking the questions.
- 🔊 Go for as many questions as you can in four fast minutes. Have one person as a scribe and have them write all the questions down verbatim, word for word as they hear them.



Scenario

You have been invited to a county economic development meeting to speak to how the Trent Hills area has become so well known for sustainable lifestyles and activities that are advancing a green community movement.

For example: Being a bee city community, having a growing local food sector, zero waste businesses, community gardens, biking infrastructure, an environmental film festival, partnerships and collaboration between environment and conservation groups and cultural/community groups.

This is an exploratory first meeting to share the Trent Hills journey with the county. What questions arise for you as you approach this meeting?

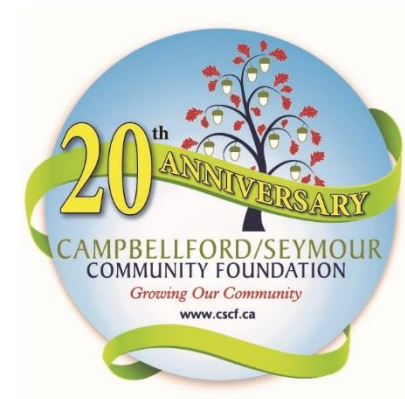
